





General Information

- **Combat Center is the largest (\$600M/year) enterprise in the entire Morongo Basin**
 - **Approximately 21,000 Active Duty Military, family members, and retirees; approximately 1,800 civilian employees**
 - **Material and Services (i.e., \$10M electric bill/year)**
 - **Over \$200M in new construction**
 - **Currently conducting a Joint Waste Water Treatment Plant Study with the City.**
 - **Working on a joint solar project with Copper Mountain College and JTNP**
 - **Night sky commitment - 250K spent in 2007 , replacing light fixtures complete survey being conducted.**



Residents and Employees

- . Approximately 10,742 active-duty Marines, Sailors and Soldiers
 - 8,121 Marines in operational tenant commands
 - 1,200-2,300 student population
 - 1,232 Marines assigned to base
 - 715 Sailors at base and tenant commands
 - 8 Soldiers assigned to the Veterinarian Clinic

Support to the Community

- **Established the Community Liaison Office in Feb 07 to provide a single source for the community to interact with the base.**
- **During fiscal year 2006 the base generated \$589,534,981 of economic impact for the community.**
- **Direct Support within the Community Color Guards – 28, Other events - 18,**
- **Established the Tortoises Research and Captive Rearing Sites so that vulnerable tortoises and hatchlings are protected until they can fend off predators on their own. Currently have a very high success rate of eggs to hatchlings.**
- **Explosive ordnance training for local and state law enforcement.**
- **Toys for tots 37,537 toys collected and distributed to the Morongo Basin and Coachella Valley.**
- **Blood drive ; 1,862 pints of blood collected on the base for the local blood bank.**

Support to the Community

The base Fire Dept expended 1,367 man hours on 172 fire, rescue or emergency calls in off –base neighboring communities in 2006.

The Base Fire Department responded in support of the Oct 2007 Running Springs fire.

Conducted Fire Awareness Training to 200 Outside firefighters . Utilizing old military housing slated for demolition, allowed the firefighters to train and practice attacking actual fires and zero visibility search and rescue.




- At xxxx, Unit began an EOF during security and observation operations at OP 448 on MSR Road 9.8km North of Camp xxxx (IVO xxxx).
- Unit observed a vehicle stop on MSR xxxx (IVO xxx) at a historic IED site. Unit used the LRAS to inform the vehicle to move from the area.
- **When the vehicle did not move**, Unit fired 1x round of 5.56mm (M16) into the ground at the front of the vehicle. The vehicle then fled to the west.
- OP xxxx (IVO xxxx) stopped the vehicle and conducted a search with NSTR. The vehicle was then released.
- There were no injuries or damages to CF equipment.
