# Planning

## ■ Need For The Desert Plan

- Basic Conflicts
  - Natural environment
  - Human social demands
- Federal Land Policy & Management Act of 1976
  - Directs BLM to inventory CDCA resources and to prepare a comprehensive land-use management plan for the area.
- California Desert Conservation Plan
  - Energy Production and Utility Corridors
  - Geology, Energy and Minerals

## ■ CDCA Plan - GEM

- Goals
- Database
- Multiple-Use Class
  - Casual Use
  - Surface Disturbance, -5ac
  - Special Areas – PO, +5ac
- Implementation
  - Make land available
  - Ensure reclamation
  - Make data available

## ■ CDCA Plan – EP& UC

- Goals
- Decision Criteria
  - Considerations

# Planning



## ■ Implementation

- Sites associated with power generation or transmission not identified in the Plan will be considered through various planning processes to include Plan Amendments.
- 14 Amendments approved since 1980.
  - Deletion all or portions of corridors
  - Designated new corridors
  - Activated portions of contingent corridors
  - Granted permission to construct outside the corridor



# CDD Priorities

## ■ FY 2007 Annual Work Plan

- BLM top priority for FY 2007
- Process energy and related actions efficiently
- CA BLM 07 Strategic Priorities
  - Implement National Energy Plan
  - Complete Truckhaven Geothermal leasing
  - Expedite renewable/nonrenewable permits & related infrastructure
  - Address access to energy resources in LUP
  - Make mineral materials available for energy development
