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Who Are We?

- Geographic Scope - Mojave Desert portion of San Bernardino County, and Death Valley and Joshua Tree National Parks
- Coalition of Federal & State land managers and local organizations
- Purpose - coordinate efforts and expertise to deal with common invasive weed species

Advantages

- Coordinate efforts on a watershed or landscape basis (across jurisdictional lines)
- Share information and resources
- Project funding opportunities
- Public education & outreach
- Private landowner assistance

- Develop an invasive weed management plan
- Acquire funding for implementation of control projects


